On June 17, we announced our \$7.5 million capital campaign to provide the institute with a suitable home in Krannert Memorial Library, endow a directorship and other key areas, and digitize and preserve the mayoral materials in our archives. Civic leader and former Deputy Mayor David Frick is chairing the campaign committee.

UIndy senior Tim Coxe was instrumental in development of a slick new online voter aid during his summer internship with the Indiana Secretary of State's office. The service enables Hoosiers to view lists of all of their elected officials, from U.S. president to local school board. You can read about Tim's work, the announcement of the Institute for Civic Leadership, and other highlights from 2010-11, in our year-in-review magazine, *1400*.

Meanwhile, we're looking ahead to hosting another civic event in October as a preview of the role of the institute: a debate between the two candidates for Indianapolis mayor, sponsored in partnership with three local media outlets. Details are being finalized but you'll be hearing more this summer.
