MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Please help us keep your storm drains open. The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is asking residents and property owners to do their part to rake leaves away from the curb and regularly check and clear storm inlets. There are more than 10,000 miles of drainage facilities in Marion County. Approximately 6,000 of those miles are on private property and must be maintained by property owners, according to Sections 431-506 and 561-211 of the Revised Code of the City and County. <u>CICOA</u> is an Area Agency on Aging, so designated by the State of Indiana, Family Social Services Administration. As such we provide a wide range of services, many of them in-home services, to seniors and people with disabilities regardless of age. Our goal is to help our clients live in their home or community of choice for as long and healthy as possible. We have over 200 employees and one office on the northeast side of Indianapolis.

The active group mentioned in the newsletter is The Social of Greenwood, formerly the Greenwood Senior Center at 550 Polk Road, Greenwood. It is independent from CICOA. They do have all the activities, and more, that are mentioned in the newsletter at that location. They also welcome and encourage membership from the Southside of Indianapolis.

We do deliver a hot lunch to The Social of Greenwood and encourage seniors and any who would like to share a meal with a senior to attend the luncheon site. It is a service under our Meals 'n More department that also provides home delivered meals. For seniors age 60 and over, we ask for a contribution of \$2 for the lunch. People will not be turned away if they do not make a contribution. For individuals under age 60, the meal is \$6, unless one is married to someone over 60.

The meals are made daily by a local caterer and delivered fresh and hot. We also deliver luncheon meals to locations on the Southside of Indy. They are listed below. One is the Green Park Terrace on East Meridian School Road, across the street from Hill Valley.

FAQ FOR SHARED ROADWAY MARKINGS

Q. I've seen these markings of a bike with two chevrons/arrows above it on the streets. What do they mean?

A. These are Shared Roadway Bicycle Markings which are intended to help bicyclists position themselves away from parked cars, to avoid being struck by suddenly opened car doors, and to alert other road users to expect bicyclists to occupy travel lanes. These markings will also be used in situations where it may not be obvious where bicyclists should be riding, such as at intersections with multiple turn lanes.

Q. Can't bicyclists just look into parked cars as they ride and see if someone is about to open the door?

A. Bicyclists, like all road users, need to constantly scan the entire roadway for safety. Checking every car for a driver is difficult to do while paying attention to the road. Also, it is often impossible to see drivers due to large parked vehicles blocking the view of other parked vehicles, tinted windows, headrests, etc. Motorists should check their side view mirror or look back prior to opening their door. It is the driver's responsibility should any collision occur.

Q. If I see these markings in a lane, is the lane only for bikes?

A. No. This marking is used for travel lanes that are shared by bicyclists and motorists. Shared lanes are different than bike lanes which are set aside for bicyclists and are marked by a solid white line.

Q. So, if I don't see these markings, then it's not a shared lane and bicyclists aren't supposed to be there?

A. No. Bicyclists can ride on any street in Indianapolis except for limited access freeways with signs explicitly prohibiting.

Q. Are these markings going to be on every street that does not have a bike lane?

A. No. These markings are used primarily on streets designated as part of the Indianapolis' bikeways networks. Additional sharrows may be considered on a case by case basis.

Q. I never used to see these markings. Why are they being used now?

A. Prior to 2005, there was no official marking to use on streets with shared lanes. Now we have a marking for areas on the road where traditional bike lanes are not applicable, or possible, due to roadway restrictions.

These items may be dropped off at any of the city's free ToxDrop sites. Residents are limited to disposing of twenty-gallons (20) of liquid waste or seventy-five (75) pounds of solid waste, per visit. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month from 9am – 2pm.
