#### MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Please help us keep your storm drains open. **The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is asking residents and property owners to do their part to rake leaves and debris away from the curb and regularly check and clear storm inlets.** There are more than 10,000 miles of drainage facilities in Marion County. Approximately 6,000 of those miles are on private property and must be maintained by property owners, according to Sections 431-506 and 561-211 of the Revised Code of the City and County. For these property owners, drainage responsibilities include clearing storm inlets. ## CENTRAL INDIANA COUNCIL ON AGING (CICOA)

CICOA is an Area Agency on Aging, so designated by the State of Indiana, Family Social Services Administration. As such, we provide a wide range of services, many of them in-home services, to seniors and people with disabilities regardless of age. Their goal is to help their clients live in their home or community of choice for as long as possible. They have over 200 employees and one office on the northeast side of Indy. *The Social of Greenwood*, formerly the Greenwood Senior Center at 550 Polk Road, Greenwood is active and available for seniors over the age of 60. It is independent from CICOA. We do deliver a hot lunch to The Social of Greenwood and encourage seniors and any who would like to share a meal with a senior to attend the luncheon site. It is a service under our Meals 'n More department that also provides home delivered meals. For seniors age 60 and over, we ask for a contribution of \$2 for the lunch. People will not be turned away if they do not make a contribution. For individuals under age 60, the meal is \$6, unless one is married to someone over 60. The meals are made daily by a local caterer and delivered fresh and hot. We also deliver lunch meals to locations on the south side of Indy including the Green Park Terrace on East Meridian School Road, across the street from Hill Valley.

## HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND TOXIC DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hazardous household waste consists of items like cleaners, paint, motor oil, gasoline, batteries, weed and insect poisons that are dangerous to our environment. These items may be dropped off at any of the city's free ToxDrop sites. Residents are limited to disposing of twenty-gallons (20) of liquid waste or seventy-five (75) pounds of solid

waste, per visit. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Saturdays of each month from 9am - 2pm.

**NEW RESIDENTS** - We have noticed many new residents moving into our neighborhood. We have contact information on some of you but it is very incomplete. There are over 1100 homes in Hill Valley. Our Homeowners Association arranges for snow plowing and a quarterly Newsletter to inform everyone what is coming up next, including zoning bulletins. **CITIZEN'S TRANSFER STATION** – Do you ever find yourself making a trip to the landfill to get rid of heavy trash and/or debris? Save yourself 75% off the cost of going to the landfill or using a private service to haul away your items. Haul them to the Marion County Citizens' Transfer Station:

2567 S. Belmont Ave. Indianapolis, IN 46221

They are open on Saturdays from 8am to 4pm. The cost to drop-off a safely-loaded car-load is \$2.00 and the cost for a pickup truck load is \$5.00. Trailer loads are not permitted. Only regular or heavy trash items will be accepted. Items like construction materials should be reused if possible.

**ORDER TEMPORARILY PROHIBITING OPEN BURNING -** Pursuant to Indiana Fire Code 307.1.1 a prohibition on all open burning at any time by any person in any place in the fire special service district in Marion County and such other territories where the Indianapolis Fire Department provides fire protection services as provided by law is hereby in effect.

A significant fire hazard remains in all areas subject to this order due to persistently dry environmental conditions and the absence of significant rainfall in the weather forecast. The risk of fire constitutes a hazardous condition requiring heightened vigilance and caution.

This order prohibiting open burning is in effect for all Cities, Towns and Townships in the fire special service district of Marion County, as defined by Section 111-3 of the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, and such other territory where the Indianapolis Fire Department provides fire protection services as provided by law. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, any open burning, comfort fires, camp fires, agricultural burning or similar legal fires. This prohibition does not apply to outdoor grilling or fireworks, although extreme caution should be used in such situations.

This order remains in effect indefinitely and until such time as the Indianapolis Fire Department determines that weather and environmental conditions have sufficiently mitigated present hazardous conditions and the significant threat to persons and property. All persons who violate this order are subject to fines imposed by the Indianapolis Fire Department and potential civil and/or criminal penalties.
