## 2011 INDY PARKS AND RECREATION ICE RINK AND SMOCK DOG PARK

<u>Perry Park Ice Rink</u> will open on October 1<sup>st</sup>. It is located at 451 E. Stop 11 Rd. and you can contact them directly at 317-865-1833. They are open most days for at least a 2 hour window of open skating.

Annual Pooch Passes are based on the January-December calendar year. Passes include a tag for your dog and a gate access device for you for <u>one</u> of four Indy Parks Bark Parks. *Very Important Pooch Pass* is based on the January-December calendar year. Passes include a tag for your dog and a gate access device for you for <u>all four</u> Indy Parks Bark Parks. VIP passes are available for purchase at the Broad Ripple Park Family Center. Annual pooch passes are available for \$75 (VIP passes for \$125) or daily passes are available for \$5. A discount will be applied on tags for your second and third dogs!

### To obtain a Pooch Pass or VIP pass:

1. Bring with you, all pooch vaccination records documenting current inoculations for Rabies, Parvo, Distemper and Bordatella. 2. Visit the Perry Park office to obtain a Pooch Pass.

## NEIGHBORHOOD DRAINAGE

Please help us keep your storm drains open. **The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is asking residents and property owners to do their part to rake leaves away from the curb and regularly check and clear storm inlets.** There are more than 10,000 miles of drainage facilities in Marion County. Approximately 6,000 of those miles are on private property and must be maintained by property owners, according to Sections 431-506 and 561-211 of the Revised Code of the City and County. ## NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME WATCH NETWORK

In West Hill Valley a vacant home was robbed of all copper piping through the crawl space under the home. Please report any activity at vacant homes to police and if possible secure your crawl space if you are going to be away. "Flipping" is also a problem. This is when a thief walks through parking lots and driveways flipping car doors to find an open door and then steals anything of value from the car. There have been several incidents of this. Please lock your car doors even in your driveway.

A home is robbed every 14.6 seconds and the average dollar loss per burglary is \$2,119, according to statistics just released by the <u>Federal Bureau of Investigation</u>. And that's the good news because burglaries were down slightly in 2010 compared to 2009. Sure you lock your doors and windows when you're not home (you'd be surprised how many people don't). But here are a few things that you're probably doing that make your home a target, and what you should do instead: **1. Leaving your garage door open or unlocked**. Once inside the garage, a burglar can use any tools you haven't locked away to break into your home, out of sight of the neighbors. Interior doors between the garage and your home often aren't as strong as exterior doors and may not have deadbolt locks **Instead:** Always close and lock the garage door. Consider getting a garage-door opener with random codes that automatically reset. **2. Hiding spare keys.** Burglars know about fake rocks and leprechaun statues and will check under doormats, in mailboxes, and over doorways. **Instead:** Give a spare set to a neighbor or family member. **3. Relying on silent alarm systems.** Everyone hates noisy alarms, especially burglars. Smart thieves know that it can take as long as 10 to 20 minutes for the alarm company or cops to show up after an alarm has been tripped. **Instead:** Have both silent and audible alarms. **4. Not securing sliding doors.** These often make tempting targets. **Instead:** When you're out, put a dowel down in the channel, so that the door can't be opened wide enough for a person to get through. **5.** 

**Relying on your dog to scare away burglars.** While barking my deter amateurs, serious burglars know that dogs may back away from someone wielding a weapon, or get chummy if offered a treat laced with a tranquilizer. **Instead:** Make your home look occupied by using timers to turn lights, radios, and TVs on and off in random patterns. **6. Leaving "goody" boxes by the curb.** Nothing screams "I just got a brand new flat-screen, stereo, or other big-ticket item" better than boxes by the curb with your garbage cans. **Instead:** Break down big boxes into small pieces and bundle them together so that you can't tell what was inside.

### HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND TOXIC DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hazardous household waste consists of items like cleaners, paint, motor oil, gasoline, batteries, weed and insect poisons that are dangerous to our environment. These items may be dropped off at any of the city's free ToxDrop sites. Residents are limited to disposing of twenty-gallons (20) of liquid waste or seventy-five (75) pounds of solid waste, per visit. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Saturdays of each month from 9am - 2pm.
