



MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Hill Valley Residents:



As most of you are aware of by now, the issue of placing Verizon 5G small cell towers in Hill Valley has arrived. The majority of our residents are opposed to the installation of these poles throughout the neighborhood. The information and map was sent to residents on whose property they will be installed at and those living one or two houses from the placement. These poles are to be placed at the location where the signs are located announcing the public hearings. The map shows16 locations for West Hill Valley and 9 for East Hill Valley.

Pat Rooney, an attorney who lives in East Hill Valley, has offered to represent us as a remonstrator at the virtual hearings for the installation of these poles. He sent us a

petition to help gather signatures of opposition (*a copy is included towards the end of this newsletter*). Many of you have signed the petition. We appreciate your support.

Another concern is the type of poles to be installed. They are wood poles with cable boxes and that is the reason for the variances. The nicer, more attractive ones are black metal with an LED light. The virtual hearing will be October 27th.

Due to the Global Pandemic, COVID-19, we were unable to secure a location to hold our 2020 October annual meeting. Therefore, it is cancelled until further notice.

As always, please call myself or another board member if you have any questions or concerns. On behalf of the board members, we thank you all for your support.

VERIZON 5G NETWORK CELL POLES

We have kept everyone updated about the progress of the Verizon 5G Network and their variances to use wood poles via e-mail. SNOW REMOVAL



With all of the hot and warm weather, it seems to be too early to bring up this subject. However, did you know that your Hill Valley Homeowners Association is responsible for plowing snow from the streets in our neighborhood except for the loop on Rahke Road, West Hill Valley Drive between Rahke Road and Meridian Street, East Hill Valley Drive, and East Street from East Hill Valley Drive to Stop 11 Road? No tax dollars are spent, and the city is not responsible for plowing our neighborhood streets.

We hire private companies to plow our streets. While we have had only a one snow over three inches last year, some in the past

were unbelievable. If there is snow forecast, please park your vehicles in your driveway. Parking in the driveway speeds up the plowing so our streets are open faster and it keeps you from getting your vehicle plowed in on the side of the street. Courts are always a problem because the streets have to be plowed first. Then the trucks have to find a place to stash the court snow without blocking the street or the driveways. <u>DPW Snow Plowing Information</u>.

OPPORTUNITIES TO VOLUNTEER WITH YOUR HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION

Open Board Seats – we currently have a couple of open board seats available. You would be elected at the October Annual Meeting (One meeting a month on the 3rd Monday of the month). If you are interested in participating, you may be appointed to the board at any board meeting.

Membership Chairman – this person would ideally like record keeping. It would entail keeping records of members who pay dues, depositing membership money at our bank, checking the post office box for correspondence, helping us determine who gets an invitation to the Summer Picnic (only paid members get an invitation) and keeping the board informed of our membership progress throughout the year. You will be using MS Access to maintain the database and continuing instruction will be provided.

NEIGHBORHOOD DRAINAGE

Please help us keep your storm drains open. The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is asking residents and property owners to do their part to rake leaves away from the curb and regularly check and clear storm inlets. There are more than 10,000 miles of drainage facilities in Marion County. Approximately 6,000 of those miles are on private property and must be maintained by property owners, according to <u>Section 561-211 of the Revised Code of</u> <u>the City and County</u>. For these property owners, drainage responsibilities include clearing storm inlets. FALL LEAF PICK-UP

Leaf collection will begin on Monday, November 9, 2020. You may leave up to 40 bags of leaves for pick-up per week during the four-week collection period. Leaf collection will conclude on Friday, December 4, 2020.

Here are a few guidelines:

- Place leaves in plastic bags. Paper bags can deteriorate and break apart in wet weather.
- Keep bags at least three feet away from your trash cart for easy pickup.
- Leaf bags should be outside by 7 a.m. on your normal trash day.

While raking leaves, please clear leaves from storm drain inlets to prevent drainage and flooding problems. You are also asked not to rake leaves into the streets. Last year, about 4,800 tons of leaves were collected. The leaves are taken to the South Side Landfill where they are composted. You can pick up the resulting mulch in the spring at no cost.

Please remember that burning leaves is illegal in Marion County. For more information visit indy.gov/activity/leaf-collection-season.

HOW TO REPORT POTHOLES

Indianapolis has created a way for the public to report potholes with the Mayor's Action Center website. The website allows users to open pothole requests across the city. Users can report a pothole or track one they reported earlier through the Mayor's Action Center by calling (317) 327-4MAC (4622) or by visiting <u>www.indy.gov/activity/report-potholes</u>.

HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND TOXIC DROP-OFF LOCATIONS



Hazardous household waste consists of items like cleaners, paint, motor oil, gasoline, batteries, weed and insect poisons that are dangerous to our environment. These items may be dropped off at any of the city's free ToxDrop sites. Residents are limited to disposing of twenty gallons (20) of liquid waste or seventy-five (75) pounds of solid waste, per visit. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month from 9am - 2pm.
