Drop-off locations are as follows:



SNOW REMOVAL

Did you know that your Hill Valley Homeowners Association is responsible for plowing snow from the streets in our



neighborhood except for the loop on Rahke Road, West Hill Valley Drive between Rahke Road and Meridian Street, East Hill Valley Drive, and East Street from East Hill Valley Drive to Stop 11 Road? No tax dollars are spent, and the city is not responsible for plowing our neighborhood streets. We hire private companies to plow our streets. While we have had only a one snow over three inches last year, some in the past were unbelievable. If there is snow forecast, please park your vehicles in your driveway. Parking in the driveway speeds up the plowing so our streets are open faster and it keeps you from getting your vehicle plowed in on the side of the street. Courts are always a

problem because the streets have to be plowed first. Then the trucks have to find a place to stash the court snow without blocking the street or the driveways. <u>DPW Snow Plowing Information</u>.

WHO ARE OUR CHIN NEIGHBORS?

They are not much different from our own ancestors. They are strange to us because we cannot communicate with them well, if at all. Have you considered how strange we are to them? The Chin are a peace-loving people who have found freedom in a new country.

Thousands of Chin have escaped the persecution and death that was their fate in Burma, or as it is now known as the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. The Asian country shares borders with Thailand, Bangladesh, India, and China. The Burmese Military, Junta, has been asked to respect just the basic human rights but to no avail. The Chin are generally from the West side of Burma, from the State of Chin and have an agricultural background.

We want to welcome the Chin and others from the Burmese area to Indianapolis, and especially to Hill Valley. Most of the Chin population is



Christian with a minority worshiping Buddha. My church home is Friedens UCC and it has celebrated over 100 years in existence. The original name was Deutches Evangelische Friedens Kirche and the original sermons were in German. Is there really a difference between us and the Chin?

COYOTES ADJUST TO LANDSCAPE-INCLUDING URBAN AREAS

Urban conflicts are focused on attacks on pets and concerns for safety. Coyotes are native to Indiana and reports of coyotes began to increase in the 1970s. They have adjusted to the landscape changes and now are common in all Indiana counties, including the Hill Valley area. For most, the sight of a coyote is new and little is known about how to live with this species. The DNR has a full list of tips to minimize conflicts with coyotes. **Prevention and Control:**

- Feed pets indoors and pick up leftovers if feeding outdoors
- Eliminate water bowls and other artificial water sources (if possible)
- Position bird feeders in a location that is less likely to attract small animals or bring the feeders in at night (to keep coyotes from feeding on the bird food or the other animals)
- Do not discard edible garbage where coyotes can get to it
- Trim and clean shrubbery near ground level to reduce hiding cover for coyotes or their prey
- Do not allow pets to run free
- If you start seeing coyotes around your home, discourage them by shouting, making loud noises or throwing rocks but NEVER corner a coyote always give the coyote a free escape route.
