As we all know major streets take priority. Standing water is an extreme problem whenever it rains. The drains become clogged with debris and the flooding affects the other streets in the area also. Many residents pointed out it is almost too dangerous to drive on. Dan expressed his desire to make this happen. We are confident he will make every effort to get this project on the priority list.

HVHA welcomes any members who would like to volunteer to be on the board. We invite anyone interested to attend a board meeting. We meet at St. Barnabas every third Monday each month, except December, at 7:30pm. Currently, we are in need of two more members.

### CITY-COUNTY COUNCILORS' DISTRICTS TO CHANGE

Democratic leaders of the Indianapolis City-County Council will introduce proposed new council districts. The districts, if approved, would take effect for 2023 city elections. The existing Council members are Councillor Jared Evans: District 22 and Councillor Paul Annee: District 23. We are all now in District 23 and it will be split as shown on the drawing with Council 22 on the west side of Meridian and Council 23 on the east side. This has not been passed but it is most likely since the City-County Council has a Democrat majority. If it is passed, it will stand for ten years before the redistricting is done again in accordance with the State of Indiana statutes. Click here for the full 2024 proposed map.

### HELPING REDUCE CRIME IN OUR AREA

We have had reports from a few of our residents about burglaries in their homes and break-ins of vehicles that are parked in their driveways. Please be sure to always check your surroundings,

on various streets have formed their own "neighborhood watch" by conversing with their fellow neighbors on a regular basis in order to stay aware of any potential problems or crimes. Think about possibly forming something similar to this for your street or area. Not only is it helpful for emergencies, but it helps to get to know your neighbors. If you witness a potential crime, please call 911 immediately. Always be alert to your surroundings! It's better to be safe than to be sorry!

#### WHAT TO DO ABOUT POTHOLES

When you see a pothole, please jot down the location of damage/potholes, deterioration info, and take a picture of it. Then you can report it by completing a request to let the proper people know about it. You can download the app in your cell phone

app store. It's called "REQUEST INDY." The app will guide you through each step. You will receive a confirmation at the end of the request to keep for reference. On a computer or smart phone, you can also go to <u>http://maps.indy.gov/RequestIndy/</u>, which is preferred over calling simply because when you call, there may be long wait times. If you only can make calls, then you may do so by calling (317) 327-4622. Please write down the case number



for follow-up. Please note, if the city doesn't know about the pothole issues, then they will not fix them. Don't assume that one of your neighbors have already notified the city about the pothole that you just hit! The more requests they receive for the same issue, the more likely it will be fixed much faster. Crews have filled more than 118,000 potholes thus far this year!

#### CONSTRUCTION SEASON



As strip-patching (closing down a driving lane and resurfacing an area that is

normally one lane wide) and other road construction begins this season, DPW (Department of Public Works) encourages drivers to give construction crews the space they need. Drivers should watch for orange barrels and cones, slowing down through construction zones and using caution around workers. By the way, the state law requires you to slow down and/or move over for construction areas,



or emergency lights (Orange, Red, or Red/Blue). The speeding fines through construction zones is extremely expensive!

#### LAWNS AND LANDSCAPING

Spring is upon us, so please keep your lawns and landscaping maintained. Most folks in our neighborhood work really hard to maintain their yards. We ask all homeowners to keep the dandelions down and not let the seeds spread to other yards. If you are one of the homeowners with a good growth, please mow often. As long as you catch the yellow blossoms before they mature into white seeds, you will be able to stop the weed from spreading. Set your lawn mower to prevent it from cutting the grass lower than 2 to 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches, since longer grass will block out the

sunlight needed for dandelions to grow. Merely mowing down the dandelion will not permanently kill the dandelion, but it will keep it from spreading to your neighbor's yard.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE INDIANAPOLIS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

There are many policies you should know as home owners. According to the DPW, property owner responsibilities include:

- Working with neighbors to clear brush, debris and other blockages from neighborhood creeks and ditches
- Maintain swales (a low or hollow place especially a marshy depression between ridges) and ditches, including roadside ditches, by mowing grass to eight inches or less, and keep them free of debris. Be sure not to mow when the ground is wet to avoid rutting
- Keep storm inlet grates, driveway culverts and cross pipes in good repair and clear of debris, trash, and leaves
- Not dumping debris/yard waste in or along waterways
- Picking up after pets to avoid pet waste from entering waterways
- Use approved practices for erosion control for creeks that run through private property. To endure the specific type of practice is permissible in waterways, be sure to check with the Department of Business and Neighborhood Services at 317-327-8700
- AND always call CITIZENS ENERGY GROUP (CEG), at (317) 924-3311 (and press \*2), to report flooding on city streets and side walks or illegal dumping in waterways
