HAZARDOUS HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND TOXIC DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Hazardous household waste consists of items such as cleaners, paint, motor oil, gasoline, batteries, weed and insect poisons that are dangerous to our environment. These items may be dropped off at any of the city's free ToxDrop sites. Our closest drop off point is the Perry Township Government Center at 4925 S. Shelby Street. You may drop off items on the 2nd Saturday of each month from 9am – 2pm.



2022 INDY PARKS AND RECREATION POOL SCHEDULE

Perry Park and Pool is our local pool. Through community and business partnerships, Perry Park is making a difference. Established in 1961, Perry Park is the ONLY current Indy Parks ice rink, and it hosts the South Stars High School hockey team,



South Indy Youth Hockey league, Sycamore Figure Skating Club, and Total Package Hockey. The park was remodeled in January 2013 with the help of Citizens Energy Group. The Perry Park Aquatic Center has two large water slides, including a tube slide for our patrons 48 inches or taller. It also hosts a smaller polar bear slide and play area for the younger children.

Perry Park is open Wednesday through Sunday from 11am-2pm and 3pm-6pm (closed Monday and Tuesday). Perry Park is located at 451 E. Stop 11 Road, and you can contact them directly at 317-889-0825. They do offer discounts for groups of 15 and over. Marion County residents will be able to sign up for FREE pool passes that will be valid all summer long. To sign up, adults must show proof of residency such as a utility bill, rent or mortgage statement, school enrollment materials, driver's

license, or other items. You can hear all about the free passes at 317-888-0070. Come join the fun and experience the all new water equipment!

MESSAGE FROM THE HOA BOARD

Please help us keep your storm drains open. The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) is asking residents and property owners to do their part to rake leaves and debris away from the curb and regularly check and clear storm inlets. There are more than 10,000 miles of drainage facilities in Marion County. Approximately 6,000 of those miles are on private property and must be maintained by property owners, according to Sections 431-506 and 561-211 of the Revised Code of the City and County. WHAT TO DO ABOUT POTHOLES

When you see a pothole, please jot down the location of damage/potholes, deterioration info, and take a picture of it. Then you can report it by completing a request to let the proper people know about it. You can download the app in your cell phone app

store. It is called RequestIndy mobile app. The app will guide you through each step. You will receive a confirmation at the end of the request to keep for reference. On a computer or smart phone, you can also go to https://maps.indy.gov/RequestIndy/, which is preferred over calling simply because when you call, there may be long wait times. If you only can make calls, then you may do so by calling 317-327-4622. Please write down the case number for follow-up. Please note, if the city doesn't know about the pothole issues, then they will not fix them. Don't assume that one of your



neighbors have already notified the city about the pothole that you just hit! The more requests they receive for the same issue, the more likely it will be fixed much faster. Crews have filled more than 118,000 potholes thus far this year!

Indy DPW reminds motorists to drive with caution and give crews the space they need to safely work. Drivers should watch for orange barrels and cones, slowing down through construction zones.

LAWNS AND LANDSCAPING



Summer is here, so please keep your lawns and landscaping maintained. Most folks in our neighborhood work really hard to maintain their yards. We ask all homeowners to keep the dandelions down and not let the seeds spread to other yards. If you are one of the homeowners with a good growth, please mow often. As long as you catch the yellow blossoms before they mature into white seeds, you will be able to stop the weed from spreading. Set your lawn mower to prevent it from cutting the grass lower than 2 to 2 ½ inches, since longer grass will block out the sunlight needed for dandelions to grow. Merely mowing down the dandelion will not permanently kill the dandelion, but it will keep it from spreading to your neighbor's yard.
