MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Hill Valley Residents:

Good news for the residents on Fabyan Road! DPW started work on this project March 31st. On Monday April 3rd, they completed the work with the drainage pipe in the yard. They will have more repairs with the drainage pipe under the street. We don't have a timeframe as yet. It is so nice to drive by without the high water covering the street. We want to thank Anna, from DPW for her assistance.

In the last few months, I've had several calls from residents regarding their neighbors having chickens in their backyards. The most common complaint is the noise. Here is the Marion County code, which was put in place on January 11, 2012:

CHICKENS, QUAIL, PIGEONS, AND DUCKS:

<u>Section 743-306</u> - Accessory and temporary uses; W - Personal livestock, and in Table 743-306-3 - Permitted Personal Livestock. This code states that a resident may have up to 12 chickens and 1 rooster. Roosters must be kept in an enclosed coop or similar fully-enclosed structure, from dawn until dusk. Another complaint is dilapidated chicken coops with plastic over



the openings flapping in the wind. Outside exercise area and pasture must be fenced. Pen, shelter, coop, roost, hutch, or other shelter for animals CANNOT be located in a front yard and must meet setbacks required in the District. Animals must at all times be confined to the lot. Clean water must at all times be present and available for the animals. Feed must be animal-appropriate and stored in such a manner as to prohibit contamination by moisture, mold, and insects and to restrict access by rodents. Odors from the animals or from animal waste must not be discernible at any property line. Waste must be collected and removed or composted regularly. If a resident wishes to have more than 12 chickens, they must get a personal livestock license, otherwise, no permit is needed if resident has only 12 chickens.

Just to clarify, it is legal to have chickens in your backyard in Marion County. Please follow the city guidelines. Please be respectful of your neighbors.

Should you attend a monthly meeting which are held on the third Monday of every month at 7:00 pm at St. Barnabas Church, you would be surprised at how many calls Bonnie receives each month, and in which she then contacts the proper person in our local Government to find your answers! As they say, "The ball is now in your court!" You can step up by paying your \$45 to this organization going or contribute to its demise.

It's always good to report them just in case no one else has, and the more complaints they receive, the more likely they will get them fixed quicker. We have found that

if you send more than one request for a particular pothole, it seems to get addressed quicker.
