






NEIGHBORHOOD CRIME WATCH NEWS



FALL LEAF PICK-UP

Wow! Can you believe it's almost Fall again??? It's the time of year when all the leaves are falling and everyone is vigorously raking and packing leaf bags! The 2025 schedule for leaf pick-up begins on Monday November 10 through Friday December 5, 2025. This service is free of charge. Here are some things to remember when preparing leaves for pick-up:

- ✓ You can set out up to 40 bags of leaves each week with your regular trash.\
- ✓ Please only use large plastic trash bags; paper bags deteriorate in wet weather.
- ✓ Place full bags on the street by 7 am on your collection day.
- ✓ Keep bags 3-5 feet away from your cart/trash can collection area and out of sidewalks and public rights-of-ways.
- ✓ Please ensure that you are keeping leaves away from storm drains to prevent flooding.

Sunday December 14 through Friday December 19: Our judges will view and make their final choices.


